Overview

Armed or hostile intruder incidents in educational institutions such as the Columbine High shootings in the USA and more recent incidents in Finland and Germany in 2009 are rare, however, there is the potential for an armed intruder incident at a UK college.

Terrorist attacks in the UK are also a real and serious danger. According to the National Counter Terrorism Security Office it is possible that educational institutions throughout the UK could be the target of a terrorist incident.

Why Hostile Intruder Training?

Educational institutions have a duty of care to provide their pupils and students with a safe and secure environment – a fundamental pre-condition for learning. There are legal and commercial reasons why institutions' security plans should deter such acts, or at least minimise their impact.
